## Public Notice: Fraudulent Employment Scam

It has recently been brought to our attention that MedStar and the citizens we serve have been targeted by a fraudulent employment scam.

## Things you should know:

- 1. We will not consider an applicant for a position at MedStar who has not first submitted an application through our Careers portal (<u>www.qhire.com/medstar</u>).
- 2. We do not correspond with applicants through any type of direct messaging application.
- 3. We do not extend job offers to individuals who have not been interviewed in-person
- 4. We do not currently, nor do we have any plans to hire anyone for remote work.
- 5. We will never contact you from or ask you to reply to (finance@medstar911.org) regarding employment opportunities.
- 6. We will never ask you to deposit a paycheck for *"training materials"* or for any other purposes.

If you believe you have been contacted by MedStar regarding employment opportunities, you may contact us to verify the communication at 817-923-3700 and ask to speak to an HR representative.

If you suspect you have been a victim of an employment scam we strongly encourage you to report fraudulent activity immediately.
